Volumes include over 100 Illustrations of everything from the exterior of the building to statues and exhibits. Hundreds of pages of descriptions. Condition: Overall fine although there are brown spots on most of the pages, the spine is missing from 2 volumes and the cover is off on one of those. There is spine damage on the other 4 volumes, one has tape on the spine and some of the spine cover is missing. The New York Crystal Palace was located on 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 42<sup>nd</sup> Street, also known as Bryant Park.

In the center is "Exhibition of Industry of All Nations. New York 1853." These were award medals, and they were not marked with a winner's name. The holder has a brass colored decorated metal frame. The medal has 3 cuts in the edge where metal pieces are fitted to hold the medal into the frame. Only one of these metal holders comes with this piece. Size: 2 1/4" diameter. Condition: Very Fine.
