

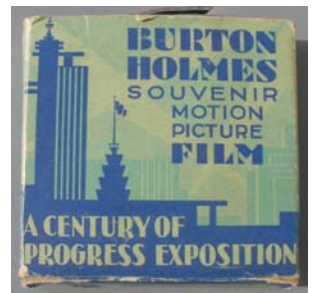

By submitting bids in this auction, whether by telephone, fax, Internet, email, mail or any other method, you agree to the Terms and Conditions of Sale as follows:

1. This is an **Absentee Auction**. There is an online catalog with color pictures. There is a printed version available, however it has black and white pictures. All contents including photographs and descriptions are Copyright © 4th Dimension Collectibles and are not to be used without the written permission of 4th Dimension Collectibles.

2. **Bid Closing Time:** The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday October 23rd, 2012 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot. This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. When a bid is placed on a lot, the timer is reset to 10 minutes. When the 10 minutes has passed and no bid has been placed, that lot will sell to the highest bidder.

If using the Internet, you MUST REFRESH your bid page to see bid amounts and the timers change.

The reverse pictures the Crystal Palace and has written above "The Building for the Great Exhibition in London, 1851". Below the building is "Proposed by H.R.H. Prince Albert, Designed by Joseph Paxton Esq. F.L.S., Erected by Fox Henderson & Co., - Dimensions - Length 1848 Feet, Width 456 Feet, Height of Principal Roof 66 feet, Height of Transept 108 feet, Glazed Surface 900,000 Feet, Occupies 18 Acres of Ground. Size: 2 15/16" diameter. Condition: Very Fine with a couple of rim dents and dings and most of the white silvery finish is gone. Estimate: \$ 75 - \$ 125	\$ 20
	Lot # 2 - Blue transferware plate with the image of the 1851 Crystal Palace in the center. Around the edge is a flower design. Size: 9 3/8" diameter. Condition: Very Fine. There are no chips, cracks or hairlines, but there is crazing and browning in the center of the plate on both the front and the back. Estimate: \$ 60 - \$ 80	\$ 30
	Lot # 3 - China plate with the picture of the "Crystal Palace 1851." in the center. The border of the plate is a raised white daisy design. The back is marked with the maker name that I can't read. This plate is from a series made for the exposition and it is rare. Size: 7 1/8" diameter. Condition: Very Good, there several edge chips and brown staining. The image is dark and clear. Estimate: \$ 40 - \$ 60	\$ 25
	Lot # 4 - 2 Volume Set "The Crystal Palace". The title page states "The Crystal Palace described and Illustrated by Beautiful Engravings chiefly from Daguerreotypes by Beard, Mayall, &c &c.". Also titled "Tallis's History and Description of the Crystal Palace and the Exhibition of the World's Industry in 1851;" Inside the 2 volumes the book is divided into 3 volumes with a total of 640 pages of text and over 225 illustrations. The edges of the pages are gold leaf. These books have all the information that you would ever want to know about the Crystal Palace with wonderful pictures of the statues and exhibits. Size: Each volume is 9" wide by 11 1/4" high. Condition: Fine. Both volumes are complete. There is some spotting on the pages. The leather covers are worn, especially in the corners. The cover of volume 2 is mostly separated from the pages at the spine. Estimate: \$ 100 - \$ 150	\$ 50
	Lot # 5 - "Crystal Palace 1851" book. "An Illustrated Cyclopaedia of the Great Exhibition of Industry of All Nations." 	<p>Lot # 6 - Paper cover Children's Book. "Aunt Busy-Bees", "The Fine Crystal Palace the Prince Built" with a picture of the Crystal Palace on the cover. Condition: Very Good, the bottom left corner is missing from all the pages. Some of the pages are separated. There is a little spotting throughout and overall age toning (but not bad for the age). The certificate is signed by both the Secretary "Richard Nixon" and the President "E. Richardson". In the center is an engraving of an eagle, shield, industrial items, 2 placards and "1884-5 Exposition New Orleans". This item is very rare, I have never seen a stock certificate from this fair before. Size: 11 15/16" wide by 8 1/2" high. Condition: Very Good. The certificate is yellowed and a bit brittle and there are a couple of large tears (where it was folded for years) and some paper loss on the edge, especially in the upper left corner. I believe you may never see another of these.</p> <p>Estimate: \$ 300 - \$ 500</p>	\$ 150

	<p>Lot # 17 - Set of 4 Ironstone bowls, each with a black transfer picture of a building from the 1893 Exposition. The images are: "The Administration Building", "The Government Building", "The Electrical Building" and "Machinery Hall". Each is marked on the back "Dresden" above a sphere ("warranted" is written in the center of the sphere) and "China" below. This is an uncommon set. Size: Each is 4 7/8" diameter by 7/8" high. Condition: They all have crazed surface. 2 are Extremely Fine, one is Very Fine and one is Fine (it has some light browning).</p> <p>Estimate: \$ 100 - \$ 150</p>	\$ 75

	<p>Lot # 18 - Cigar Box, "Colombo" with multicolor inside label that pictures Columbus pointing to Chicago on the globe along with 6 major buildings from the 1893 fair. On the side of the box is the side label picturing Columbus pointing to the globe. The cigars were made by "J. Schussele Manufacturer." of Baltimore. Size: 8 1/4" wide by 5 1/2" deep by 2 3/8" tall. Condition: Fine. The top is not connected to the bottom. The inside label has staining. The outside label is torn in several places and has been reglued at the top of the label. The box is stained. 	<p>Lot # 19 - Pocket Mirror with Celluloid backing. Pictured in Black on the celluloid is "Machinery Hall", "World's Columbian Exposition 1893". This item is very uncommon. Size: 2 5/8" diameter. 	<p>Lot # 21 - Watch fob. Brass chain with an Amber Translucent Circular Charm at one end and a hook at the other. The material of the charm is probably glass. The Obverse pictures the bust of Columbus with "World's Columbian Exposition 1892" around the image. The Reverse is exactly the same as the reverse of the Columbian Half Dollar with the image of the Caravel above 2 globes with "World's Columbian Exposition 1892" around the edge. 	<p>Lot # 23 - Stanhope in a pen. The Stanhope pictures "Machinery Hall", "Chicago 1893". The pen is made of bone. Size: 7 7/8" long. Condition: Stanhope is Excellent. Pen is Extremely Fine. The pen's point is not original. Estimate: \$ 25 - \$ 35</p>	\$ 12
	<p>Lot # 24 - Plate with raised image of exposition buildings with "World's Fair Chicago 1893" at the bottom. The ceramic is painted brown and green. Size: 5 15/16" diameter. Condition: Excellent with only the slightest wear. Estimate: \$ 50 - \$ 75</p>	\$ 25
	<p>Lot # 25 - Egg shaped toy. The object of this game is to get the egg to stand on its edge. The top of the egg is etched with a picture of Columbus's head and shoulders with "1492-1892" above his image. Below, running around the egg is "P.M. Baumgardner & Co. Chicago Manufacturers Pat. Apl'd for". Below that is "Columbus Egg Puzzle". Size: 2 1/2" tall. Condition: Good, since this toy invariably rolls off the table when the player fails to get it to stand on its edge, it has many dents. It also has corrosion and there is a crack where the 2 halves meet in the middle. Estimate: \$ 20 - \$ 30</p>	\$ 8










	<p>Lot # 26 - Stand Up with reverse painted image of "The Ferris Wheel", "Height 264 Feet". The image pictures a large Ferris Wheel with several other fair buildings surrounding it. The image is contained in a metal frame that has a design (flower and plant) hammered into it and a stand attached to the back. On the back, above the stand is a hanger so the piece could be hung on the wall too. Size: Image is 3 1/2" diameter. Stand up is 6 13/16" high by 4 5/8" wide. Condition: Very Good, there is flaking at the bottom where the writing is (and it is very hard to read) and a few spots in the sky of the image and overall age toning of the stand. The detail of the Ferris Wheel is not great because the silver color blends in with the lines that define the car.</p> <p>Estimate: \$ 25 - \$ 40</p>	\$ 12
	<p>Lot # 27 - Reverse glass image of the "Administration Building", "World's Fair, 1893". This is the glass insert that would have gone into the metal and stand ups. 	<p>Lot # 28 - "Last Nail 1893" Pencil. Turn the nail head at top and a graphite tip emerges. The other side of the nail is marked "World's Fair 1893" Size: 3 13/16" long. Condition: Very Good, there is wear to the finish overall. The pencil mechanism works, turn the top and the point comes out.</p> <p>Estimate: \$ 25 - \$ 35</p>	\$ 10
	<p>Lot # 29 - Silk Ribbon, "Souvenir", "Woven in the Columbian Exposition Chicago 1893". With 2 eagles on sitting on a pair of American Flags, the other on an American Shield. In the center is written in blue "The Star Spangled Banner O long may it wave". Then in red "Oer the Land of the Free and the Home of the Brave". The original tassel hangs below.
