

- 1. This is an *Absentee Auction*. There is an online catalog with color pictures. There is a printed version available, however it has black and white pictures. - 2. Bid Closing Time: The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday September 13th, 2016 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot. This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. - Color footage of fairgrounds showing exterior of several buildings: Waterfall at electric utilities, fountains, bus, Merrie England and US Steel. Rides in the amusement area include: pontoon boats and planes, Inside Frank Buck's Jungleland. Many shots from the play Railroads on Parade, showing most of the modes of transport through the ages. Parts are a little fuzzy. About 9 minutes running time.
- Switches to Black &White with other shots of fairgrounds and a marching band. About 3 minutes running time. By Alec Rose.
- Color film of outside shots of the fair. The Parachute jump, workers on the Perisphere, a parrot, Scottish marching band, Old New York, facades and an outdoor strong man show with dancing girls. The Aquacade show, water bugs, Inside GM's Futurama (color is rare), the Dare Devil drivers, Night exteriors and of course the fireworks. The pictures are fuzzy. About 11 minutes running time. Film by Alec Rose.
- Color film includes: T&P Murals, statues, fountains and exteriors of buildings. modeling of furs at the World of Fashion, Exteriors of Amusement area and main buildings. Running time about 9 minutes.
- B&W w/ sound 1940 World's Fair Promotional Film, discusses the fair and then is about the Ford Pavilion. Ford is a 3 part show: Road of tomorrow where you ride in a new ford, the production wheel and other manufacturing displays. Amusement area and "of course the fireworks". It's a little fuzzy but the sound is clear. About 10 minutes running time.
- Official Film in Black & White with sound, includes aerial shots of the fairgrounds, tour of
  the fairgrounds with names of buildings and features with colorful dialogue. Lots of
  amusement area exhibits. Highlights of Railroads on Parade. The sound is bad and the
  picture is a bit fuzzy. About 10 minutes running time.
- Color Film, starts with elevated shots, some shots of the grounds and then more shots of the grounds from an elevated spot, possibly the helicline. Scottish dancing, and more second half has some bad spots in the film. About 8 minutes running time.
- "Official films presents New York World's Fair Produced by: Leslie Wink". This film includes: fair at night, cars driving at Ford. The end of film has "The Seal of the Best in Home Movies". This film is red and blurry.
- Color Film with added music, includes: Inside the Futurama ride, Monkeys eating and birds, more night shots, amusement area, Frank Buck monkeys, baboon and lions, Midget Town, inside GE lightning show, American Jubilee. Railroad station at fair, T&P, GM & Ford exterior, riding on a tram passing lots of buildings with the T&P popping up between the buildings constantly. Then onto other parts of the fairgrounds, Films while walking around of statues and fountains. Very good picture and color - a little jerky from filming while riding.
- Color film with added music, including: GE lightning a good show, fountains and exteriors, dusk shots, Italy and its waterfall, and inside the Aquacade. The film has strong color.
- Color film with added music, showing a mishmash of inside and outside shots and who knows what. Images are slightly fuzzy.
- Color film with added music showing GE lightning and more exterior shots, shots of the grounds, fountains at night and fireworks. The film has weak color.
- Color film with added music showing the tram going by statues and exteriors of buildings.

• "Blackhawk Film", "1939 - 1940 New York World's Fair" in Black and White with sound, includes: Time Capsule, Diorama of New York City, "President opens the New York World's Fair", the opening day parade, foreign buildings, opening ceremony, a tour of the fair, visit of the King and Queen of England, inside Futurama, 1940 opening, and the Dare Devil Drivers.

Total running time 1 hour 50 minutes.

Note: There are many interesting shots contained in these films. One film has color shots of a dance performance that is black and white in another film. There are also 3 different shots of the GE lightning display.

If you want a film that gives you the flavor of the 1939-40 New York World's Fair, by showing the usual and the unusual, then this is the film for you.
