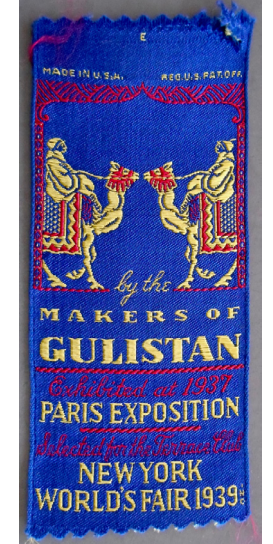


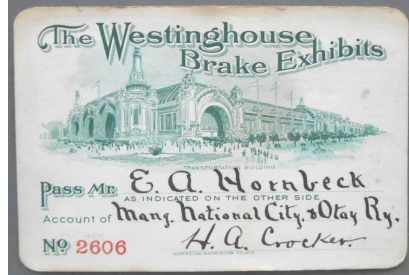

1. This is an *Absentee Auction*. There is an online catalog with color pictures. There is a printed version available, however it has black and white pictures. All contents including photographs and descriptions are Copyright © 4th Dimension Collectibles and are not to be used without the written permission of 4th Dimension Collectibles.

2. **Bid Closing Time:** The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday March 3rd, 2020 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot. This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. When a bid is placed on a lot, the timer is reset to 10 minutes. When the 10 minutes has passed and no bid has been placed, that lot will sell to the highest bidder.

Reverse: Shows a cobbler in the center with "School Shoes" written around him. Around the edge is "Kirkendall Jones & Co." and "Every Pair Warranted". 	Lot # 22 - Powder Jar with a multicolor picture of the Administration Building. The jar is milk glass with blue decorations around the side of the base. The top pictures the Administration building with Machinery Hall to the left. Brass rings connect the top to the bottom with a hinge in the back. Rare. Size: The diameter of the base is 5" by 2 3/4" tall. Condition: Fine since the name of the building and fair that was below the picture in black writing has been rubbed off. There are also a couple of spots on the right side of the picture. There is no damage to the glass, brass, hinge or clasp. Estimate: \$ 300 - \$ 500	\$ 150
	Lot # 23 - Bristol Glass picturing the "Administration Building" in brown with the rest of the glass colored turquoise. There is gold around the top rim. Size: 2 3/4" diameter by 3 1/2" tall. Condition: Excellent, but there is wear to the gold rim. Estimate: \$ 100 - \$ 150	\$ 50

	<p>Lot # 24 - Wooden clock in the original box. The front of the clock shows "Columbus" at top and "Anno 1492" at bottom. The clock is open on both sides showing the gears, which are also made of wood, with metal attachments. There are wooden weights attached to cords at bottom. 3 medal weights are included, one is a large heavy weight and the other 2 are acorn shaped. The acorn weights hang on the top wooden bracket. The clock was made with only one hand, the hour hand. This clock comes in its original box. The lid of the box shows a picture of the clock and reads "One Columbus Clock" and gives directions on how to hang. The label is darkened, but legible. Made by Bostwick & Burgess Mfg. Co Norwalk, Ohio. The weights are hard to find as well as the box. Size: Clock is 14" tall (without string) by 5 1/2" wide by 5" deep. Box is 6 1/2" wide by 6 1/4" high by 15" long. Condition: The clock is Excellent however there is one repair on the bar at top where the acorn weights go. 	<p>Lot # 25 - "World's Fair Picture Puzzle" by "Parker Brothers" picturing the Administration Building and a gondola on the cover. The puzzle is a multicolor chromolithograph of an aerial view of the fairgrounds with the names of the buildings printed on each building. This is a children's toy with 23 large pieces to put together. Size: Box is 9 1/4" wide by 7 1/2" high. The puzzle when put together is 11 5/8" wide by 11 3/4" wide. Condition: Fine. The box top is soiled and there is tape on all the corners of the aprons on the top and bottom (and a little part of the aprons are missing.) There are blue stars pictured between the 2 sides. It is weighted on the bottom so that it stands on one end. Marked in tiny letters "Made in Germany". This is a rare souvenir. 	<p>Lot # 27 - Ferris Wheel Envelope with the official US 2 cent Postage stamp of Columbus Landing with 2 "World's Fair Station" cancellations, one on the stamp and one on the left side of the envelope. The cancellation date is "Oct 19 1893" at "12-30p". Under the picture is "Ferris Wheel. Greetings from the White City." Inside is a letter with 3 color pictures of fair buildings at the top. The letter describes the Ferris Wheel as "a fine ride". Being from Ohio they wrote about visiting the Ohio Building. Their last event was to go to the Buffalo Bill Show. At the end is a PS. "Keep this letter for me". This item is Rare and a wonderful keepsake from the fair. Size: Envelope is 5 1/4" wide by 4" high. The letter, which opens to reveal more writing inside, is 5 1/8" wide by 7 3/4" high. Condition: Overall Fine. The envelope has been opened on 3 sides. The very top of the stamp, the perforations and a little more has been cut off. The second cancellation is over the Ferris Wheel image. The letter has many black spots that appear to be ink smudges from when it was written. Estimate: \$ 50 - \$ 100</p>	<p>\$ 25</p>
	<p>Lot # 28 - Game, "Jeremiah Judkin's Trip to the Fair". This is a reading game where you fill in the blank in the story with whatever is written on the randomly selected piece of paper. There are probably 100 pieces of paper with phrases written on them. The instruction sheet has the story of the Judkin's family trip to the "Great World's Fair in Chicago". This game was given out by Lion Coffee, part of the Woolson Spice Company. The toy includes an unmarked box that is used to hold the slips of paper. There are also 14 round pieces with numbers on them from 1 to 15, that came with the toy, but I suspect that they are from another toy and were thrown in with this toy the last time that this toy was played with.
