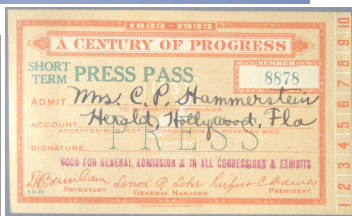

2. **Bid Closing Time:** The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday March 2nd, 2021 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

**10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot.** This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. 

	Lot # 20 - Turquoise Art Glass Creamer with beautiful gold decoration "World's Fair 1893" painted on the side. The creamer is Mount Washington art glass. There are ribs running vertically around the whole creamer. It has an applied handle. The blue glass is much rarer than the pink glass pieces. Size: 2 3/8" tall by 3 7/8" wide from spout to handle. Condition: Near Mint. Estimate: \$ 200 - \$ 300	\$ 100
	Lot # 21 - Stand Up with reverse painted image of "The Ferris Wheel", "Height 264 Feet". The image pictures a large Ferris Wheel with several other fair buildings surrounding it. The image is contained in a metal frame that has a design (flower and plant) hammered into it and a stand attached to the back. On the back, above the stand is a hanger so the piece could be hung on the wall too. Size: Image is 3 1/2" diameter. Stand up is 4 5/8" wide by 6 3/4" high. Condition: Very Fine. There is a spot of missing paint near the edge at 8 o'clock. The frame has some age toning. Estimate: \$ 40 - \$ 60	\$ 20
	Lot # 22 - Plug Tobacco Holder and Slicer with raised image of the Landing of Columbus with "Columbian Souvenir" above the picture and "1492 Chicago 1893" below. This is a rectangular metal box with a spring loaded flat surface inside. When you lift the handle (the image is on the handle) the top swings back to expose the inside. A tobacco plug is inserted inside pushing the spring down. Above the top is a bent piece of metal designed to not only keep the plug from popping completely out, but to allow the plug to rise about 1/8 inch above the edge of the box. The part of the handle that covers the box has a sharp edge. When you push the handle down, you slice off a piece of the tobacco plug. The bent part above the top is on a hinge and can be bent back to allow a new plug to be inserted. This is quite an imaginative device, allowing a person that chews tobacco the ability not only to carry the plug without getting tobacco residue in their pocket, but also providing a way to conveniently cut a slice off the plug. (Listed in Rossen # 5 on pg. 135-6, but is incorrectly described as a cigar cutter.) Size: 1 3/4" wide by 3 5/8" high by 3/4" deep. Condition: Extremely Fine, slight toning and a few light scratches on the back. Works perfectly. Estimate: \$ 75 - \$ 125	\$ 35
	Lot # 23 - Pair of Cuff Links, each with Reverse Glass multicolor picture of Machinery Hall in a square brass plated holder. At the bottom of each picture is "Exposition Chicago 1893". The back has the button that slips through the hole in the sleeve. Size: Each is 3/4" square. Condition: The images and the tops are Extremely Fine with a little wear to the brass finish and a couple of light scratches. The clasps on the back do not move, so they are only Very Good. Estimate: \$ 20 - \$ 35	\$ 10
	Lot # 24 - Cast Iron Bell Ringing Pull Toy of Columbus in the Santa Maria with wheels on the bottom. Columbus is removable (and is often missing). Size: 7 1/4" long by 3 1/4" wide (wheel base) by 5" high. Condition: Poor. The front wheel is missing and the mechanism from the back wheel that rings the bell is missing. One side of the holder for the front wheel is broken off. The finish is very dark. Estimate: \$ 35 - \$ 50	\$ 17
	Lot # 25 - Die Cut Card with Multicolor Chromolithograph of the Art Palace in the center with leaves and berries around the edge. At the bottom, in cut out letters, "Souvenir of the Columbian Exposition". Size: 6 5/8" wide by 5 1/4" high. Condition: Extremely Fine. The tiny piece in the upper left corner is separating. (These cards are usually all broken in the bottom writing.) Estimate: \$ 30 - \$ 45	\$ 15

	<p>Lot # 26 - Plate with the following written on it: "Chase &amp; Sanborn's 'Seal Brand' Coffee Served Exclusively to the Over Twenty-one Million People", "Admitted to the Columbian Exposition Chicago 1893." "Souvenir in Daily use at World's Fair." "Universally accepted as the Leading Fine Coffee-of the World". This is an advertising plate that was used at the fair and then taken home by the visitor. Bottom of the plate is marked "U.R.W." with a picture of an eagle's head with something in its month. Size: 5 5/8" diameter. Condition: Extremely Fine, a little wear to the word Chicago and just above. Estimate: \$ 35 - \$ 50</p>	\$ 17
	<p>Lot # 27 - China vase with brown, purple and green picture of "Agricultural Building Chicago" and gold around the rest of the surface. Marked "made in Germany" on the bottom. Size: 3 1/4" tall by 2 3/4" handle edge to handle edge. Condition: Good, one of the handles has been broken and glued back together. The gold is rubbed off above the picture, on the top, the handles and part of the back. Estimate: \$ 25 - \$ 35</p>	\$ 12
