This book has more information about the exhibits than the Official Guide Book. The cover is blue with gold writing. Very Rare. Size: 10 3/4" wide by 13 7/8" high by 7/8" thick. Condition: Very Good. There is a 1/2 split at the bottom of the spine. There is contact paper on the inside covers and the first page.
