The First World's Fair held in the United States. The New York Crystal Palace was located on 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 42<sup>nd</sup> Street, also known as Bryant Park.

On the back is written "Sarah Shewell Hayden, The Horticulture Building, World's Columbian Exposition, Watercolor, 1893, 6 7/8" x 10 1/2." Sarah Hayden (1862-1939) graduated with honors in 1890 from The Art Institute of Chicago. She had three watercolors accepted in Chicago's 1893 Woman's Building at the World's Columbian Exposition. (Probably did not include this painting). The painting is matted and framed behind glass. Biography from the Museum of Nebraska Art. Size: Image is 10 1/2" wide by 6 7/8" high.
