1. This is an **Absentee Auction**. There is an online catalog with color pictures. There is a printed version available, however it has black and white pictures. 2. **Auction Closing Time:** The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday, October 17th, 2023 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

Timed lot closing: 10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot. This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. When a bid is placed on a lot, the timer is reset to 10 minutes. The First World's Fair held in the United States. The New York Crystal Palace was located on 5th Avenue and 42nd Street, also known as Bryant Park.

The original frame or holder is included although it was broken when the medal was removed and the medal will no longer stay in the holder. One clip that goes into the edge of the medal is included.
