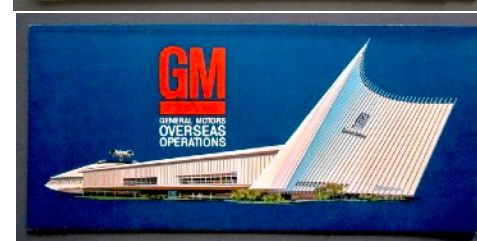
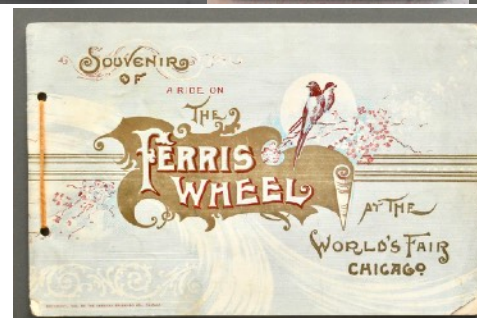
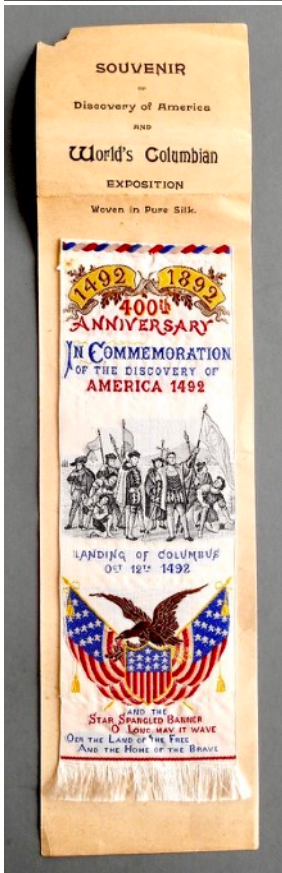

2. ***Auction Closing Time***: The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday, February 6th, 2024 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

Timed lot closing: 10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot.
