By submitting bids in this auction, whether it be by telephone, fax, Internet, email, mail or any other method, you agree to the Terms and Conditions of Sale as follows:

1. **This is an Absentee Auction.** There is an online catalog with color pictures. There is a printed version available, however it has black and white pictures.

2. **Bid Closing Time:** The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2008 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

**10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot.** This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. When a bid is placed on a lot, the timer is reset to 10 minutes. When the 10 minutes has passed and no bid has been placed, that lot will sell to the highest bidder.

**If using the Internet, you MUST REFRESH your bid page to see bid amounts and the timers change.**
