


2. **Bid Closing Time:** The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday September 20, 2022 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot. This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. When a bid is placed on a lot, the timer is reset to 10 minutes. When the 10 minutes has passed and no bid has been placed, that lot will sell to the highest bidder.
