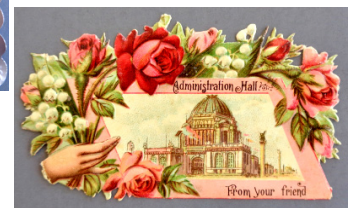
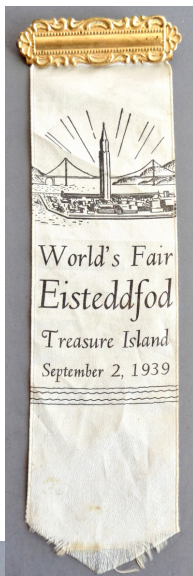

1. This is an **Absentee Auction**. There is an online catalog with color pictures. There is a printed version available, however it has black and white pictures. 2. **Auction Closing Time:** The auction bidding officially ends Tuesday, September 16th, 2025 at 10 PM Eastern Time.

Timed lot closing: 10 minutes before the end of the auction, when you refresh your bid page, a timer will appear next to each lot. This timer will indicate how much time is left to bid on each individual lot. When a bid is placed on a lot, the timer is reset to 10 minutes. When the 10 minutes has passed and no bid has been placed, that lot will sell to the highest bidder.
